#### Parish Council Information.

The PC would like to give everybody an update on recent achievements and current projects.

The Parish Council lease the Village Hall and have approved damp proof work which has been organised by the Village Hall Committee.

In the Spring we expect the installation of the new passing bay opposite Rowley Copse which we hope will make the bend safer to negotiate for all who use the Highway. The addition of 'No Parking – Passing Bay' signs already installed has, we hope, improved the driving experience on the C120 between the main Village and the A3102. Despite having to contribute 25% of these the costs to Wiltshire Council (WC) for these projects we are pleased to announce that we hope to freeze the 'Precept' for April 2025 – 2026.

We hope completion of works at the A3102/Primrose Hill junction will make us all feel safer when exiting /entering the Village. The problem of the buses parking and taking breaks on the A3102 restricting residents view when exiting the C120 appears to have been resolved.

We negotiated a considerably earlier 'Verge cut' from WC than last year which has helped maintain the general condition of our Highways. Once again, we thank Andrew Gaisford for doing some of the work a little in advance.

We thank Steve Bennett for being quick to clean the roads after the Maize cutting and appreciate the 'mud on road' signs were up nice and early to warn us.

With help from Bill Moore, we have invested much time in working on the Tockenham Emergency Plan (All Parishes in Wiltshire are being encouraged to do this) which is now in its advanced stage. A support group to the PC has now been formed. Further details on this project will be announced soon. For those not aware we have Five Councillors who together cover areas of finance and planning and also have their own individual areas of responsibilities.
